

March 5, 2023

Jesus Met My Greatest Need

Scripture Study: John 4:7-18, 25-26



Many of you know my son, Luke, is a runner. He runs for sport, he runs for exercise, he runs for FUN (We don't know where he got it?). Over time he has learned what things are key to good performance in running. Good shoes are a must. Being diligent in running frequently, eating the right foods, getting proper amounts of rest, among other things are very influential in his times on the track, cross country course, or in a marathon. But, he has learned that, above all other things, drinking adequate amounts of water and other things that hydrate the body is an irreplaceable component in having a good running experience.

Our bodies are quite sensitive to the critical components for our performance. How much more sensitive we should be; body, mind, soul, and spirit; for the living water that we can only get from Jesus.

Context: This is a well-known narrative from the life of Jesus. There was much racial tension between the Jews and the people of Samaria. Many Jews would bypass Samaria in their travels even if it increased the distance significantly. Also noteworthy, the previous passage tells that it is the 6th hour (noon) when the woman comes to the well. This is significant because it was customary for women to come to the well early in the morning to avoid the heat of the day. Many believe the woman did this to avoid the scorn of other women for her indiscretions. Lastly, it is significant that Jesus is even talking to the woman because of the ethnic and gender divide. Jewish men certainly did not speak to Samaritan women. His disciples are shocked at this reality.

Today's Focus: Understanding that only Jesus can satisfy our spiritual thirst is the first step in finding true satisfaction in life.



Jesus Restored My Life

Scripture Study: John 5:2-11, 19-21

Time and time again I have heard the story of how Jesus intervened in a person's life to work in ways of healing

that are beyond human ability or comprehension. Upon hearing the grim realities of a recent cancer diagnosis or upon learning that someone had lost their job and the mortgage payment was due or, maybe most significantly, to hear of someone who had slipped so far into the clutch of sin that there seemed to be no hope it is easy to think of our circumstances as being hopeless. However, Jesus is able to restore what is broken in our lives. In fact, He is the only one who is able to truly heal any and every broken part of our lives.

Context: In last week's lesson we saw Jesus and His disciples at Jacob's well in His meeting with the Samaritan woman. Jesus continues His tour of miracles on route to Jerusalem. Upon His arrival He finds a man who joins a "multitude" of others who hope to get into the healing waters of the Pool of Bethesda.

Today's Focus: Understanding Jesus' power over every aspect of our lives and learning to turn to Him for healing and restoration.



Jesus Gave Me Grace & Forgiveness

Scripture Study: John 8:2-11



Most of us would agree that forgiveness is one of the most desirable, but difficult actions a person could aspire to. In his book, *Experiencing God's Forgiveness*, Luis Palau, tells the story of Clara Barton, founder of the American Red Cross, and the intentionality she exhibited in the act of forgiveness.

Barton, "was reminded one day of a vicious deed that someone had done to her years before. But she acted as if she had never even heard of the incident. "Don't you remember it? Her friend asked. "No," came Barton's reply, "I distinctly remember forgetting it."

Forgiveness is something that God desires for us to be actively pursuing with those around us and with Himself. It can seem far from us, but with God's help and a willing heart, we can forgive like Jesus does.

Context: The crime of adultery was punishable unto death by stoning according to Mosaic law. However, the law required that both the man and woman caught in adultery be put to death (Lev. 10:20, Deut. 22:22-24). However, the adulteress man is not present. Jesus does not say whether the woman was guilty or not, but His issue is with the way in which she is being judged. Jesus understood that this was an attempt by the Pharisees to trick Him. If Jesus refuses the death penalty then the Pharisees would accuse Him of heresy against God's law. However, if Jesus confirms the accusation of the Pharisees then He would lose His reputation of compassion. Jesus always sees things rightly.

Today's Focus: Jesus models the right attitude of forgiveness.

Jesus Opened my Eyes to the Truth

Scripture Study: John 9:1-7, 32-33, 35-38



I recently had a conversation with a woman who is familiar with the deaf community and had been formally trained in sign language.. As our conversation went on, we shared stories we had both seen online about people who were born deaf, but had cochlear implants installed. Cochlear implants are a medical device that restores the ability to perceive sounds and understand speech for some people. It is amazing and heartwarming to see people’s response when the doctors turn the devices on for the first time! Can you imagine having never heard a sound to then suddenly hearing the voice of a loved one for the first time? Or, what about hearing a beautiful piece of music or the sound of your child’s cry for the very first time? When we are introduced to precious things for the first time, they are powerful and lifegiving.

Context: The book of John continues to wind through the narrative of Jesus’ earthly ministry. A pattern has formed, over and again Jesus introduces His hearers to a truth that challenges previous ways of thinking. Each time He does this it evokes two responses. For some, it sets them free from old habits or misunderstandings, but for others it brings anger and bitterness.

Today’s Focus: Jesus speaks truth that opens our eyes and sets us free.

have driven pickup trucks.


But, while commuting a

However, a couple years ago my wife purchased me a new truck for my birthday! Best birthday gift ever! It even came with an accompanying payment book! It took some time to adjust to the different perspective the truck provided, however. No matter how I adjusted the mirrors, I couldn't quite see cars in other lanes if they were in a certain spot. I had a blind spot.

Sometimes we have blind spots in other parts of our lives too.

Essentially, a blind spot is an area that we are blinded to, an area that we just can't quite see correctly.



Context: Throughout the public ministry of Jesus, the Pharisees tried to trap Him. Being unable to trick Him into saying something that would incriminate Him, they lied to Pontius Pilate, the Governor, about what kind of kingdom He sought to bring about. Jesus is arrested then brought to trial during the night. Not knowing a way to free Jesus without an uprising, Pilate succumbs to the pressures of the Jews and sentences Jesus to crucifixion.

Today's Focus: Understanding the spiritual work of the cross of Christ.

Jesus Rose Again to Give Me Life

Scripture Study: John 20:1-2, 11-18

I am sure that we would all agree that death is the strongest of all human experiences. The bonds that form between human beings through the course of life, regardless how long or short, mark our very souls. Feelings of loss and grief are of such strength that we don't know how to think or act when faced with death. I've come to appreciate the idea that we all grieve differently. Some grieve outwardly, others hold it all in. Some gain a new sense of urgency to live and others isolate themselves in sadness. Regardless of the differences in the way we grieve, it leaves an indelible mark.

Context: It's likely the most familiar scene of the entire Bible. Jesus was arrested, illegally tried, and ultimately crucified on Friday. Our text begins early on Sunday morning when Mary approaches the tomb that Jesus was laid in. The prophets and Jesus Himself predicted His resurrection, but that seems far from the minds of His disciples now.

Today's Focus:

Understanding the importance of Jesus' resurrection in our lives.



The Source of Temptation

After years of saying, ‘no’, our family made the move to become pet owners. I have many humorous stories about our adventures with Cooper, the Poodle/Bichon mix addition to our family. We’ve worked diligently at training him to observe certain boundaries in our home. But, just like with us, he is often tempted to cross over certain boundary lines. Most recently, despite having a bowl full of his own food, he nuzzles his snout under my arm while our family is at the dinner table and his freakishly long tongue will extend in an attempt to wrap around any obstructions so that he can get to the food on the table. He knows the boundaries, but the temptation to go beyond them is strong, and often his will power is weak. Sound familiar?

Context: The Book of James is sometimes referred to as the “Proverbs of the New Testament” because of its brief teachings on practical matters in the Christian life. Chapter one focuses on understanding that temptation does not come from God.

You've probably noticed that we live in a society that is self-loving. There's a certain amount of confidence that is attractive and reassuring, but we've gone beyond that. Make your rounds through Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram and you'll see that self-flattery and self-exaltation is the topic of the day, every day.

If social media isn't your thing, but sports are, consider the fact that the most popular sports in America are team sports, with football arguably at the top. Yet, virtually every play is followed by an exhibition of self-aggrandizement rather than recognizing the importance of teamwork. Recently, Tyler Lockett, wide-receiver for the Seattle Seahawks had an epiphany teamwork in a post-game interview when alluding to a former teammate when he said, "It's amazing what you can accomplish when nobody cares who gets the credit..."

Context: In Matthew 4 Jesus is spending 40 days praying and fasting in the wilderness prior to His baptism. He is approached by Satan and tempted to deny His position and calling. He uses the Word of God, primarily from the Book of Deuteronomy, to cast off the Devil.



Recovering From a Fall into Temptation

Scripture Study: Psalm 32:1-7

A church we served previously met in an old, rather run down building that was beyond repair. Not long after we came to that church the congregation agreed to purchase an empty church building not far away. Given the poor condition of the original building, the new building was a dream come true. A more modern facility, it was single level, more parking, again a dream come true... Until we began the process of preparing to move into the new building. Beyond the normal items like repainting the walls and cleaning things up, more expensive maintenance issues began to become known. Poor insulation in the attic; a damp, leaky basement; bad wiring in the electrical panels; on and on and on it went. Were the problems new? No. But, they were overlooked during the congregation's examination because the perspective was wrong. If only we could see through walls! However, God sees what no one else can because His perspective is perfect.



Context: It's assumed that David wrote this Psalm following his affair with Bathsheba. Whereas Psalm 51 focuses on David's sin nature, contrition, and God's process of atonement, Psalm 32 focuses on God's attitude toward sin and His forgiveness for all those who approach Him for help and forgiveness.

Today's Focus: Sin sneaks up and surprises us, but God sees it perfectly and victoriously forgives all those who sincerely seek His help.

The Strength to Stand Against Temptation

Scripture Study: Ephesians 6:10-18

I heard on this morning's news that Germany and the United States were sending tanks to the Ukrainian army to use in their fight against the Russian invaders. Ukraine requested tanks from these nations because it is understood that they have the most highly effective, state of the art battle tanks in the entire world. The newscast continued to say that it would take several months for the Ukrainians to be able to use them in combat due to the immense learning curve. Sophisticated technology, different language, unfamiliar equipment, on and on the difficulties go. They are incredible weapons of war, but they are only useful when you possess them and when you know how to use them. So it is with the spiritual armor that God makes available to every Christian.

Context: The book of Ephesians is divided into equal halves. The first three chapters are richly theological, they tell us the nature of God and how the plan of salvation by the works of Jesus works. The last three chapters Paul uses to give practical application to the truths presented in chapters 1-3. It is no coincidence that the last chapter is devoted to God's design for the family unit then immediately followed by a how-to manual for the Armor of God.

Today's Focus: Learning how to use the weapons that God has given us to fight spiritual warfare.

Avoiding a Critical Spirit

Scripture Study: Numbers 12:1-15



There are many causes of a critical spirit, but in our context political differences has to be one of the biggest instigators. We all have an idea of how things should be done and we all care deeply about the good of the nation. If you couple political passion with instant, and easy ways of verbalizing disagreement then you are well on your way to a critical attitude. No doubt, there are mature, sensible ways to communicate differences, and we should, but so often diverse ideas turns into something ugly and counterproductive.

To complicate matters more, social media provides a forum where discontentment and criticism of others can be shared instantly without passing through the filter of time and cooler minds. Plus, the 24 hour news cycle and news outlets with heavily biased perspectives fuel the flames of criticality by distorting headlines to make them provocative and use half-truth and mistruth to fan the flames. Sadly, this has led to many, many otherwise mature Christians to possess a caustic attitude and lose their testimony to others.

Context: The children of Israel are in the midst of their exodus from Egypt. Moses has been firmly established as their leader, but more importantly, Moses has displayed an incredible relationship with God, Himself. He's more than just a leader of people, He is God's man. Aaron is Moses' brother, and the priest of Israel and Miriam is Moses' older sister. They are both part of the leadership of God's people but become jealous of Moses' connection with God and his display of gifts.

Today's Focus: A critical spirit is not of the Lord and creates hardships for everyone involved.
